- 4. <u>Matters arising from Minutes of the Meeting on Friday 5th April</u>
 Any matters arising will be covered in the agenda; the minutes were accepted.
- 5. 'Manicure' evening: It was decided we would like this to go ahead if possible. Jenna is being contacted by Sam Hunt (in Orange Class) who sees her frequently, to find out if she is available to do manicures for a voluntary donation. Jenna is working full time, but as she is at The Brier she might be able to come over one evening after school. This would be only for staff initially and would be on a time slot basis.

6. Past events:

- 11. <u>Singing Hands</u>: Linda is liaising with Marie, Michal, Gavin, Val, Angela, Sue, Sally, and Chris Smith re arrangements then completing booking forms etc. Kingswinford Premier Inn will be named as the nearest premier Inn to both sites.
- 12. <u>Midcounties Co-operative Community Fund:</u> Our funding application was sadly unsuccessful, the reason given: 'funds allocated to our area already fully utilised'
- 13. 'An Evening With Emily': Kerrie is to contact Pensnett Social Welfare Club as she knows the Manager. Our 'Evening With Emily' held there last year was free of charge following a booking mix-up, and the Social Manager told us our next event could also be free of charge so we are hopeful! If we cannot book a Friday in the Autumn Term Emily will try and book it where she often performs (Quarry Bank Labour Club?) It will be 7.30 to late and we will try to book 13th/20th /27th of September or 4th of October. There will be a raffle with 2 hampers and the £10 voucher from Chris Davis. A letter will be sent out nearer the time with details of date, time, venue, entry fee, availability of printed raffle tickets on request plus an appeal for donations of more prizes
- 14. <u>Tesco Bags Of Help Grant</u>: as agreed our bid is to be for a Sensory Garden outside Blue and Pink classes with strong furniture, movable for if and when we move to a new building Linda had an initial meeting with Val, now needs to liaise with Chris Smith plus SLT then take bid to Maddi Bennett, Community Project Officer, who is available to give help and guidance with it.
