

More opportunities in a better purpose built building

L being able to go to pens meadow until they are 25
Nothing comes to mind apart from I'd like to see this school receive more funding for activities as this school is really fantastic and I'd like to see them get better recognition and better funding for all they do to help children progress in life
More contact via home diary for parents whose children use transport
I would like to see the land being used to its full potential as there is a lot of land on site that could benefit the pupils at Post 16
School to have a new build so the school will be on one site with extra facilities
I would like the school to extend to 25 yrs. I would like more staff, more trips for all kids. I think parents should have a transition evening at the end of each year where they come and spend an afternoon with their kids and the teachers their kids will have the following year so that they know all staff. Perhaps like a transition parents evening - see the old teacher then meet the new teachers and classroom assistants. Also internet payment system for trips and lunch would be good. There is a lot of family orientated activities for younger kids and new families. There could be higher levels of Makaton and other things and sessions about dealing with puberty for parents of kids who are growing up.
