Our second book by Frann Preston-Gannon is 'The Journey Home' when our writing focus will be an explanation.</p> <p>As always, Little Wandle phonics lessons will also continue 4 days a week, along with reading our Author of the Month books each day.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>In maths will be busy this half term. As well as our always continuing 'number', we will look at division and fractions before moving onto money, there's sure to be a class 'shop' involved.</p> 	<p>PSHE</p> <p>We'll be learning about 'My Space' this half term. The pupils will focus on their body parts and understanding which ones are 'private'. We'll be using the NSPCC PANTS song which is rather catchy. They'll also be learning about secrets, feelings and who you can trust. By the end of the topic, all pupils will understand that no mean no!</p>
