### Maple and Birch

# **English**

In English we are reading our focus book 'If only we had a Helicopter' by Roger McGough. We will be looking at the story, the themes covered and the characters.

#### Maths

The topic in maths is number. We will be covering counting and place value.

### Catering

The topic for this term is 'Christmas is coming.' The focus for the students is planning and preparing a simple meal. They will look at different options, ingredients and quantities needed. They will then prepare the food.

### Horticulture

Students will look at the different tools and skills needed to grow food in the allocated areas around school. They will learn how to plant things and then how to pick them when they have grown. Student will look at which food is best to sell when it is picked and which to make into other foods before sale.

### Art

Students will take part in selecting the type of project they which to study. This will ultimately be shown at an exhibition in school.

### **Computing - Passports**

Students will look at how to be safe when on-line including what information not to share with people you don't know, who to tell if they are unsure and what type of information to trust. Students will then work towards creating their leavers passports ready for the leaver's assembly at the end of the school year.

## **RSE**

The theme for this term is respectful relationships. Students will explore different type of relationships with family and friends ,how they fit into the different groups and the different roles played withing the groups.

#### Creative Arts

Students will take part in different types of music and dance learning about different aspects of these activities.

# Work Related Learning

This takes place on a Thursday and students take part in different work-related activities some in school and some where pupils are out for the day. Students will be visiting Nineveh care farm which is a working farm for young people with additional needs, Hawbush Community Gardens where students work on their allotment, and Baggeridge Park where they maintain the pathways and growing areas in the high ropes course area. In school, pupils take part in Enterprise where the make items which are sold at different school events.
