Oak and Elm

English

What adventures will this term's English lessons bring? Both groups will be stepping into different books and immerse themselves in the stories. Badgers will be exploring how making small changes can have a big impact through reading Sona Sharma's Looking After Planet Earth Elm. Owls will be exploring and celebrating water as they join a young girl as she celebrates that water is everywhere in Antoinette Portis' Hey, Water!

Maths

This term's maths focus will explore number in different ways. Students will be looking at identifying numbers and working with them in a practical manner while others will be working on addition, multiplication and division.

Forest School

The theme for this term is a Theatre in the Forest. What creatures will the students find? Which stories will be explored? Get ready for theatre!

Science

In Science, students will be learning about different materials and their uses. We're looking forward to experimenting and communicating our observations.

RSE
