

<p><b>English</b></p> <p>Our focus book continues to be 'Love from Anna Hibiscus'. We will be working on reading skills through shared reading of the second half of the book answering questions and sequencing the story. This will also work on sentence building in preparation for creating a newspaper report.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b></p> <p>The focus for maths this half term is addition and subtraction. <p><b>Work Related Learning</b></p> <p>This consists of a selection of off-site experiences where students may visit Nineveh Farm, Baggeridge Country park Hawbush Community Gardens and administration work at our Ridge Hill site. Students will experience a range of activities developing work related skills as they support the maintenance of these venues. In school, work related learning activities include opportunities for forest school maintenance, catering, library and administration. <p><b>Forest School and Horticulture</b></p> <p>This half term in Horticulture we continue to focus on 'Plants and Growing' with a specific focus on tools and tool safety. Students will have the opportunity to experience a range of tools and their purpose and put their newly learnt skills to test as we develop the school allotment.</p>	<p><b>Music</b></p> <p>The topic for this half term continues to be the orchestra. Students will continue studying the different sections and types of instruments and will broaden their knowledge of types of music played by an orchestra.</p>	<p><b>PSHE</b></p> <p>This half term students will complete work on mindfulness, physical and mental well-being; part of this is developing an understanding of the positive impact exercise can have on both physical and mental well-being.</p> <p>Year 14 students will be developing their understanding of respectful relationships, the foundations of a positive relationship and what a good friend looks like including emotions in response to experiences.</p>
